Several other States were also hit by Hurricanes as well. COMMITTEEMAN'S CORNER

Season's Greetings from your Louisiana National Council of Administration Member. As I have been reviewing the daily membership reports from National it shows that Louisiana is ahead of where we were last year which is a good thing. One thing that does concern me is whether we are following the National By-Laws on vetting members into Post. Seeing members put into Post when there has been <u>NO</u> Post Meeting is not the way to do things, Section 102-103 of the Manual of Procedure is very clear on the correct way to handle this. Below are those 2 sections for everyone to have at their disposal.

Sec. 102 - Applications - Affiliation of New Members. Every application for membership must be submitted on an approved, signed application outlining the applicant's honorable service, eligibility and other pertinent information. Proof of service to establish eligibility for membership rests with the applicant. The Post is responsible for assuring the eligibility of every member accepted to membership. With respect to active duty military personnel currently performing service qualifying for membership, applications may be submitted on their behalf by a member who shall certify the requisite qualifications for membership based on personal knowledge concerning the applicant and shall be acted upon in accordance with the provisions of Section 103. Active duty military personnel admitted to membership under such procedure shall, within a reasonable time, sign the application, personally certifying eligibility and subscribing to the obligation of membership. The application shall bear the name and the ID number of the member recommending the applicant and the recommendation of the Post Reviewing Committee.

Sec. 103 - Election. Applications. After the applicant has filled out the application card, it should be provided to the Post Adjutant or Quartermaster, together with the dues (and admission fee, if applicable). A receipt shall be given to the applicant. An applicant may be recommended after eligibility has been fully determined by the Post Reviewing Committee. With respect to a Department Member-at-Large, the National Organization and/or the Department Headquarters will be responsible for eligibility determination. The original application of every member will be retained on file with the Adjutant. Balloting on Applications. Before voting on the application during a Post meeting, the Commander shall allow the members present an opportunity to state their objections, if any, to the admission of the applicant. Unless one member present shall request a written ballot, a vote shall be taken and a majority of the votes cast shall decide acceptance or rejection of the application.

The 2024 Southern Conference in Nashville was a very successful one as those in attendance can attest, next year we will be heading to Conroe, Texas from 7-9 November for the 2025 Convention. During the SC Convention Ken Corr from Florida suspended his campaign for NJVCIC so that now leaves 3 of us in the race. I cannot THANK the men and women of the Department of Louisiana enough for your support throughout this campaign. We are in the home stretch now and with 8 Endorsements, the Departments of Florida and South Carolina both endorsing it puts my campaign in a good position. Lets keep the push going until August 9, 2025 when the vote will finally takes place.

The monthly Council Updates are sent to all of the District Commanders for distribution to the Posts, if you are not receiving them please contact your District Commander or send me an email and I will send them to you.

I hope each of you have a very blessed Christmas and get to relax and spend time with family and friends. As we approach the Holiday Season, take time to contact those members you have not heard from in a while and make sure they are doing ok. Do not just wait until it is time to collect dues to contact your members, do it on a regular basis. November 4th:

Veterans Volunteer to Vet the Vote: VFW National Legislative Associate Director Joe Grassi participated in a veterans-service leaders meeting hosted by the nonpartisan organization We the Veterans and Military Families. To date, more than 162,400 veterans and military family members have answered the Vet the Vote program's call to serve as poll workers for the 2024 presidential election. "The integrity of the election is strengthened because of the selfless patriots who volunteer to safeguard and facilitate this process which is vital to our way of life," Grassi said. "We congratulate and thank all our outstanding veterans and military family members who have volunteered to serve as poll workers for the 2024 presidential election. VA Secretary Briefs National Press Club Audience: VFW staff members attended an event held at The National Press Club in Washington, D.C., to hear remarks from VA Secretary Denis R. McDonough. The Secretary complimented veterans for their dedication to our nation's defense, praised VA employees for record-breaking performance caring for our veterans, provided an implementation update on the PACT Act, and recognized the plight of those who served at Karshi-Khanabad (K2). Acknowledging K2 veterans as some of the first to deploy after the 9/11 attacks, he noted the unhealthy environment to which they arrived in Uzbekistan, their consequent adverse medical conditions, and VA's actions to ameliorate their suffering. TRICARE Open Enrollment: The annual TRICARE open enrollment season kicks off on Nov. 11, bringing important updates to beneficiary enrollment and premium payments. Starting on Jan. 1, 2025, TriWest Healthcare Alliance will take over as the new regional contractor for the TRICARE West Region. Payments currently made through military allotments will be automatically transferred to TriWest, but it's crucial for affected veterans to set up their recurring monthly payments directly with TriWest before the new year. Failing to do so may result in disenrollment from their TRICARE health plan. Notably, the TRICARE West Region will now encompass 26 states, an increase of six from the previous coverage. Be sure to check your state's status and find out more details.

Take VFW Health Care Survey: The VFW has developed a new survey to evaluate your health and your experiences navigating health care. Your feedback is vital to our advocacy efforts and to compile a report on this important topic. Honoring Past and Preserving Future: As Veterans' Day approaches, attention will focus on VA organizations, service members, and individuals to assist with the smooth functioning of these hallowed grounds and to learn about the sacrifices of those interred. Possible volunteer activities include laying holiday wreaths at gravesites, participating in beautification and restoration projects, playing live "Taps" at military funerals, and providing walking tours to visitors, among many others. November 11th:

FW Participates in Veterans Day Events: VFW National Jr. Vice Commander Tim Peters participated in activities in the Washington, D.C., area on Veterans Day, Nov. 11., beginning with a visit to the White House. From there Peters headed to Arlington National Cemetery where he and VFW Auxiliary National President Brenda Bryant presented a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. VFW National Commander Al Lipphardt visited VFW comrades in eastern Tennessee affected by Hurricane Helene, then followed up with a visit to soldiers on U.S. Army installation Fort Campbell for Veterans Day.

United States Marine Corps Birthday: On Nov. 10, the United States Marine Corps celebrated its 249th birthday. Commandant of the Marine Corps, General Eric M. Smith, published a <u>birthday message</u> urging Marines to reflect on their legacy of sacrifice and commitment to freedom since 1775. He stressed the need for exceptional standards and discipline to prepare for future threats, and asserted that while technology may evolve, the Marines' ethos remains steadfast. Happy Birthday, Marines!

VA Cares for Veterans in Any Clime or Place: Natural disasters can happen anywhere at any time, but usually without substantial warning. VA benefits continue in these chaotic conditions, but unorthodox methods may be needed to ensure uninterrupted support. Mobile clinics, special one-time payments, additional months of certain benefits, instant loan approvals for life insurance, and extended grace periods for premiums are some of the tools VA uses to aid veterans in dire circumstances. Additionally, Public Contact Teams deployed to local shelters or Disaster Recovery Centers enable on-site VA assistance to connect veterans with health care and other services including housing case management. <u>Learn more</u>.

Military Recruitment Rises Despite Ongoing Challenges: The Department of Defense (DOD) has reported it successfully recruited 12.5% more personnel in fiscal year 2024 than the previous year, increasing the number of recruits from 200,000 to 225,000. The armed services saw a rise in written contracts and a larger pool of candidates entering the delayed entry program. However, despite these gains recruitment remains challenging due to low interest among youth, a competitive job market, and a decline in eligibility of young adults. Many people who are 17-24 years of age have little to no connection to military service, and the majority would need waivers to serve. To improve awareness and understanding, DOD is launching campaigns on military service value and opportunities. Read more.

November 18th:

Call to Action for Dole Act: H.R. 8371, the Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Healthcare and Benefits Improvement Act, would provide enhancements to critical health care services for veterans and caregivers who need help now and cannot wait any longer. It has bipartisan support in the Senate but is not supported by Democrats in the House. Contrary to certain opposing voices, this IS a good piece of bipartisan-negotiated legislation that had input from numerous organizations representing veterans, caregivers, and survivors from around the country. Tell your representatives to pass H.R. 8371, Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Healthcare and Benefits Improvement Act, to enhance health care services for veterans, caregivers, and survivors.

VFW Statement for House Subcommittee Hearing: VFW National Legislative Associate Director Nancy Springer provided a statement for the record for a House Veterans' Affairs Subcommittee on Disability Assistance and Memorial Affairs' hearing on a review of funeral operations at VA national cemeteries. She commented on the National Cemetery Administration's goal to provide 95% of veterans with reasonable burial options within a 75-mile radius of their homes, the status of memorial affairs technology modernization, and the indefinite suspension of military caisson support at Arlington National Cemetery. Noel spoke about how it is critical that transitioning service members have access to accredited claims representatives, like VFW Service Officers, to file for VA disability benefits before leaving the military. Military Environmental Exposure Evaluations Program: Veterans Exposure Team-Health Outcomes Military Exposures (VET-HOME) is a new VA program that uses telehealth to perform military environmental health registry evaluations. VET-HOME VA clinicians will create a detailed exposure history, record symptoms or abnormalities potentially related to the military environmental exposures, conduct a physical examination (or review the results of a previous examination), and inform veterans of their eligibility for one of VA's six environmental health registries. Changes Coming to VA Secure Sign In: VA has issued changes for signing into your VA.gov or My HealtheVet accounts. Currently, there are four ways to sign in to your VA accounts: LOGIN.GOV, ID.ME, My HealtheVet, and DS Logon. Both My HealtheVet and DS Logon will be discontinued for accessing VA accounts. My HealtheVet sign in will be available until Jan. 31, 2025. Veterans, family members, caregivers, and survivors with VA accounts are encouraged to transition how they sign in to access these accounts prior to that date. Read more.

November 25th:

House Passes Dole Act: The Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Healthcare and Benefits Improvement Act, H.R. 8371, passed in the House with a bipartisan vote of 389-9. This <u>legislative package</u>, known as the Dole Act, is being slated for a vote in the Senate. If signed into law, it would fund a range of enhancements vital to critical health care services for veterans and caregivers who need help now and cannot wait any longer. VFW Speaks at Women Veteran Caucus Event on Transition: VFW National Legislative Deputy Director Kristina Keenan spoke at the final event of the Servicewomen and Women Veterans Caucus of the 118th Congress, led by Reps. Chrissy Houlahan, Jen Kiggans, Derrick Van Orden, and Brad Wenstrup, all of whom are veterans. The discussion centered around the unique challenges that women face when transitioning out of the military such as service-connected injuries that affect fertility, mental health effects of military sexual trauma, and barriers to accessing benefits due to child care constraints. Keenan explained that it is critical that all transitioning service members have access to a service officer to file their pre-discharge VA disability claims. "We know that veterans are vulnerable to suicide during the first year after separation from the military. We also know that veterans who use their VA benefits and health care have a lower risk of suicide. Eliminating the gap between service and access to VA is incredibly important and our service officers can facilitate that transition." She cited VFW-supported legislation — H.R.3933, *TAP Promotion Act*, and H.R.4157, *Not Just a Number Act* — that would improve the transition process and gather data regarding women veterans and suicide risks.

Holiday Overseas Mail Deadlines Approaching: The U.S. Postal Service is preparing for the holiday season as many families spend holidays apart due to military service. In order to ensure overseas packages are delivered before Dec. 25, it has provided the following deadlines: Dec. 9 for all Air/Army Post Office (APO), Fleet Post Office (FPO) and Diplomatic Post Office (DPO) addresses with AE zip codes using Priority Mail and First-Class Mail; and Dec. 16 or APO/FPO/DPO addresses using USPS Priority Mail Express. Actual delivery dates may vary. Read more.

Annual Report on Military Suicide: The Department of Defense has released its <u>Calendar Year 2023 Annual</u> <u>Report on Suicide in the Military</u> that provides data on suicide rates among service members and their dependents, along with details of ongoing prevention efforts. The report indicates a total force rate increase in 2023 of 9% in suicide deaths per 100,000 service members compared to 2022, primarily involving young, enlisted men and the use of firearms. Secretary of Defense Lloyd J. Austin launched a suicide prevention campaign in September 2023 that focuses on five key areas: fostering a supportive environment, improving mental health care, addressing stigma, revising training, and promoting lethal means safety. <u>Read more</u>.

Updated Procedures Facilitate Base Access: The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) and Department of Defense (DOD) have announced an improved base access process. Since Nov. 1, entering DOD installations became easier for veterans and their caregivers. In the words of VA Deputy Secretary Tanya Bradsher, "DOD installations provide numerous benefits and critical services to our nation's Veterans, including health care. We are grateful for our partnership with DOD and the ability to implement these updates to make military installation access easier for Veterans and their caregivers." This partnership also recently facilitated obtaining health care for some veterans in Alabama, Florida, Kentucky, New York, Tennessee, and Virginia. Read more about DOD access requirements
